

Embraer S.A. is a Brazilian aerospace conglomerate that produces commercial, military, executive and agricultural aircraft and provides aeronautical services. It is headquartered in São José dos Campos, São Paulo State and was founded August 19, 1969 (~47 years ago)

The Embraer EMB-500 Phenom 100 is a very light jet developed by Brazilian aircraft manufacturer Embraer, type certificated as the EMB-500. More than 340 were in service in October 2016.

In April 2005 Embraer's Board of Directors approved the development of Very Light and Light jets. On November 9, the company announced at the annual NBAA convention that the very light jet would be called the *Phenom 100*, it also displayed a full-scale mock-up of the aircraft.

The aircraft first flew on July 26, 2007 at São José dos Campos, Brazil. It was awarded a type certificate from Brazil's National Civil Aviation Authority on December 9, 2008. The first aircraft was delivered on December 24, 2008.

The Phenom 100 has an oval fuselage with a 7.985 m³ (282 ft³) passenger cabin, a 1.47 m-high by 0.74 m-wide (4.5'x2.1') door and 1.2'x1' windows. Its unpressurized cargo hold is 1.56 m³ (54.9ft³). Its structural life is 28,000 flight cycles or 35,000 hours, built of 20% composite materials.

It has capacity for four passengers in its normal configuration, but it can carry up to seven passengers with a single crew, with an optional side-facing seat and belted toilet. The cabin interior is designed by BMW DesignworksUSA.

The aircraft is fitted with two rear-mounted Pratt & Whitney Canada PW617-F turbofan engines rated at a takeoff thrust of 7.2 kN (1,695 lb) to ISA+10 °C. The engines have dual full authority digital engine control (FADEC). An automatic performance reserve (APR) feature boosts engine output to 1,777 lb in the event of engine failure on takeoff. Later model PW 617 F-E models have a ten-minute thrust rating at 1,820 lb.

It has a maximum flying range of 1,178 nmi (2,182 km) with four occupants and NBAA IFR Reserves.

Embraer was originally planning to deliver 15 Phenom 100s in 2008 and 120–150 aircraft in 2009 but it ended

up delivering only two aircraft in 2008 and had to trim its 2009 plan to 97 aircraft. Embraer had about 30 orders in late 2014.

An assembly line was officially opened in Melbourne, Florida on 2 June 2016, adding Embraer Legacy 450 and 500 production to the existing Phenom 100 and 300 line, along a completion center/flight-prep building. The facility will be able to assemble up to 96 Phenoms and 72 Legacys annually.

Embraer Phenom 100 NF100FZ is owned by Mark Holt, the former owner of a biotech company, Varied Industries. Mark Holt flew the twin engine jet to bring customers to Mason City to help close sales. When Varied Industries was purchased by Arm & Hammer Animal Nutrition, they buyer had no need for the Phenom 100 so Mark kept it.

Holt Aviation is located in Mason City, Iowa. Now Mark Holt and his wife, Diane, use the Phenom 100 to give back by airlifting disabled veterans and children with debilitating diseases. Veterans Airlift Command is a nonprofit organization that provides air transportation for compassionate and medical purposes to injured servicemen, servicewomen, and their families.

The new paint scheme was done by John Stahr's Artistic Aviation based out of Oregon in 2016. The *Millennium Phenom*, as she is now called, is actually a

combination of military, and the movies Star Wars, Star Trek, and Back to the Future all combined into one. The plane was disassembled at Benton Harbor Michigan's Flying Colours and was airbrushed by John Stahr. After lots of sanding and clear coats, the *Millennium Phenom* was rolled out of the paint bay in May 2016 to give it the look you see today.





The Hasegawa, and the new Taimya, Ki-61 are very good kits. The Hasegawa kit comes in a variety of versions. The Tony is my favorite Japanese airplane. I love the look of the aircraft and the variations in markings.

The latest release from Lifelike shows the variety of marking options on the Tony. While specifically designed for the Hasegawa kit I'm sure that they will fit the new Tamiya kit.

Packaged in a ziplock bag, you get two A-4 single sided full color pages. The instructions have the history and side profiles as well as a common marking/stencil drawing. The references are included should you want to see where Lifelike got their pictures and information from. This sheet has markings for four Ki-61 marking options.

The decals are included on two sheets. One is 5x7 with the majority of the markings on it. The other is a very small sheet with the two blue markings on it. The decals are printed by Microscale so you know they are thin, in register and react well with setting solutions.

The first aircraft is a Hein flown by 2nd Lt Takeo Adachi of the 55th Sentai in January 1945. There is speculation about the type of Sentai emblem on the tail. And this is where I think Lifelike far surpasses most decal manufacturers. They take what they do know and are not afraid to say what is not known. They provide the argument for the selection of the markings, but they allow the modeler to decide how they want to do the markings. This particular airplane is a NMF aircraft with red markings. Lifelike makes the argument for the tail markings based off their knowledge.

The second aircraft is also a Type 1 Hein but is flown by Sgt. Shuichi Kaihou of the 39th Fighter Training Kikotai in March 1945. There are no actual photos of this aircraft but the drawing is based off of the personal accounts of men of the unit. This aircraft is mottled green over the natural aluminum finish.

The third aircraft is a dark green Hein Type 1 flown by 2nd LT Tomiho Tohda of the 55th Sentai in Feb 1945. This aircraft features four kill markings on the mid fuselage. The green upper surface and natural metal undersurfaces makes for a dramatic aircraft. The white outlined red Sentai and Hinomaru add a splash of color.

The fourth, and final aircraft, is a Type 1 Hein of the 18th Sentai in early 1945 flown by 2nd Lt. Takeshi Nakamura. This overall natural metal machine features a blue B-29 kill marking on the mid fuselage.

Superior research, world class artwork and decals are all hallmark of Lifelike Decals. This sheet is in keeping with that tradition. The Tamiya and Hasegawa Ki-61s will make great canvases for these decals. Highly recommended. Thanks to Lifelike Decals for the review copy. 



# **IJN Dark Greens**

Not long ago I built a 1/72 Zero model in the mistaken confidence that, having built several, I should know exactly how to paint everything by now. But memory had rusted a bit, and some assumptions had been superseded by newer information. I have many books on the Zero, but the source that served me best as a modeler was Nick Millman's *Painting The Early Zero-Sen*, available as a pdf from his website Aviation of Japan. Its value lay in providing all essential color information, from surfaces to components, in one place, cross-referencing several systems of color standards through a graded range of color chips.



Luddite that I am, I printed mine out and had its 28 pages comb-bound for a workbench copy; on a quality printer, the computer-rendered chips came out surprisingly well when I compared them to the ones on my monitor.

Smaller studies followed from the same source: WWII Japanese aircraft prototype colors, J2M Raiden ("Jack") colors, and MAP/RAF Colors among them. Each has its value for modelers and curators, and freely shares the fruit of many years of careful research and correspondence. The most recent, in 32 pages, covers a subject that might at first seem a simple one, but which model builders have found inherently confusing since the end of the Pacific War: Imperial Japanese Navy Dark Greens. This topic, when fairly scrutinized, does not always lend itself to easy answers, and the title makes no claims as a panacea.

Its utility is broad, however; someone relatively new to the subject can learn a lot, including the significant scholarship that shaped opinion over decades about these colors, yet it should also have something new to offer to those who have followed the subject of IJN colors a long time. Learning more about Don Thorpe's primary sources for his two seminal books, for instance, only makes one appreciate his enduring work even more.

Along with this synopsis are included precise color measurements of relics spanning decades, with selected reports of many colleagues and their own color findings, and a meticulous assessment of available hobby paints.

Part of the difficulty is that in reporting their findings, not everyone with this passion has been on the same page. As noted authority Bob Mikesh has pointed out, the standard generally used in the US (Federal Standard 595a and 595b) is not particularly useful for Japanese aircraft, as close matches for many interior and exterior coatings he has measured with a colorimeter are simply not found there. Very few of us possess all the sets of international color standards (Methuen, Pantone, etc.) which in many cases approximate these colors more accurately. And this is what makes the chips found in *IJN Dark Greens* supremely useful for anyone with a computer.

These threads are neatly synthesized in a document that may be Millman's most ambitious single project outside of the Osprey Aces titles he has authored. It does not set out to 'solve for X,' but to present as accurately as possible the range of greens in which late-war JNAF airplanes operated, and how those colors can be most accurately duplicated. It may challenge some assumptions that had replaced previous ones!

The differences between Nakajima and Mitsubishi greens merit new consideration here, to name one instance.

As in *Painting The Early Zero-Sen*, Nick has surveyed and tested just about every hobby paint representing these dark green hues, with the results presented for easy comparisons within the 21 color chips present. These cover six known shades of dark green represented as accurately as possible through use of color systems by Methuen, Pantone, and FS 595. These computer-rendered chips bear the hallmark of Millman's other color studies - that of showing the significant color *ranges* in which a set of colors might be found.

These even include certain discontinued hobby paints, as well as the old Humbrol shade for IJN Dark Green first introduced in 1967, once the standard topside color used by many modelers to represent camouflaged uppersurfaces on Imperial Naval birds. With 20/20 hindsight, this shade is far off the mark, far too blue; it's thus interesting to read how this *British* company relied on an *American* IPMS color chart to market their pioneering set of *Japanese* colors –with little if any consultation sought from Japanese sources!

Thus enshrined, it took many more years to convince stubborn modelers that the two essential colors in the set – the topside green and underside 'AN2 Grey' - were significantly wrong.

Few imagined back then that the latter was much closer to the Luftwaffe's RLM 02 than Humbrol's shade – or that its inafamous 'Mauve' was not a color at all. But as in the example and notes below for Humbrol paints (only part of that section), other 'unsuspecting' colors not indicated as IJN shades are noted where useful. Nine other hobby paints are reviewed with the same attention to detail.

"Humbrol 75 Matt Bronze Green is less saturated and slightly more olive than D1 @ 4.92 and more greyish and less saturated than N1 @ 8.69. Probably acceptable out of the tin to represent a weathered D1.

Humbrol 91 Matt Black Green is less saturated and more greyish than D1 @ 4.25 and even more so than

N1 @ 8.32. Although the green chroma in Humbrol paints seems poor and less saturated than the Japanese hobby paints, resulting in more greyish looking greens, Humbrol 91 out of the tin is probably just about acceptable in scale to represent D1 if other paints are not available.

The recent Humbrol paint colour 239 British Racing Green, although not measured or shown here, has promising potential as a basis for the IJN Greens because it provides the deep green saturation that many Humbrol dark greens lack. Mike Starmer has produced a very acceptable match for D1 with a mix of 3 parts H91 Matt Black Green and 1 part H239."

While American and British sources (think of the old Aircraft Profiles, or early issues of the U.S. magazine *Scale Modeler*) have often been wildly inconsistent in their artwork of Kate, Zero, George, and other IJN types, in terms of graphic art Japanese sources have sown their fair share of confusion over the years.

One only has to pull out several 'gatefold' artworks from older Japanese sources such as *Aviation Journal*, *Koku-Fan*, and *Aireview* magazines, as well as various *Model Art* and *FAOW* incarnations, to realize that these same IJN greens were often recalled and illustrated quite differently by artists such as Kikuo Hashimoto, Shigeo Koike, and Ichiro Hasegawa, who, in some cases, saw many of these airplanes at close range during the war.

And beyond mere artistic license, noted here by Millman are the strange inconsistencies and contradictions between Model Art's three successive color charts in publications ranging from 1986-1998 that, taken together, confused rather than clarified.

Recent literature and scholarship has been more exact in matching IJNAF aircraft types to standardized colors and the *nomeklatur* has changed due to the discovery of the wartime paint standard known as Kariki 117, but this is a subject that has never been covered in one publication so comprehensively. It should prove especially valuable to the modeler and illustrator, and forward the community's research on the topic notably. Highly recommended to all with even a passing interest in Japanese WWII aircraft. # **Cygnus with Castor Upper-Stage**

#### **Background**

The Cygnus spacecraft is an American automated cargo spacecraft developed by Orbital ATK as part of NASA's Commercial Orbital Transportation Services (COTS) developmental program. It is launched by Orbital's Antares rocket or ULA's Atlas V and is designed to transport supplies to the International Space Station (ISS) following the retirement of the American Space Shuttle.

Since August 2000 ISS resupply missions have been regularly flown by Russian Progress (spacecraft), as well as by the European Automated Transfer Vehicle, and the Japanese H-II Transfer Vehicle. With the Cygnus spacecraft and the SpaceX Dragon, NASA seeks to increase its partnerships with domestic commercial aviation and aeronautics industry. *Cygnus* is the Latinized Greek word for swan and a northern constellation.

With Rocketplane Kistler unable to meet funding obligations for its K-1 launch vehicle under the terms of the COTS agreement, NASA decided on October 18, 2007 to terminate its contract with Rocketplane Kistler and re-award its contract after a competition. On February 19, 2008 NASA announced that it had chosen Orbital Sciences as the new winner.


On December 23, 2008, NASA awarded Orbital Sciences a \$1.9 billion contract under the Commercial Resupply Services (CRS) program. Under this contract, Orbital Sciences will deliver up to 20 tons of cargo to the ISS through 2016 in eight Cygnus spacecraft flights.

By April 2010 Orbital had displayed a full-scale model of the Cygnus cargo delivery spacecraft at the National Space Symposium (NSS) in Colorado Springs, CO

Launched on an Antares (renamed from Taurus II) medium-class launch vehicle or Atlas V, the first Cygnus flight was originally planned to occur in

December 2010. The Cygnus demonstration mission was successfully launched on September 18, 2013. On January 12, 2014, the first scheduled Cygnus resupply mission arrived at the space station; the capsule carried Christmas presents and fresh fruit for the astronauts. Its arrival was delayed, first by the need to repair the station, and then by frigid weather at the launch site and solar flares that forced postponements.

With the December 2015 launch of Orb CRS-4 on Atlas V, the Enhanced version made its debut. While it was planned from the beginning to fly on the fifth mission, the Orb CRS-3 failure and subsequent move to Atlas V meant a delay. On the other hand, the lessons learned on packing and the extra capabilities of the Atlas allowed payload to be increased to 3,500 kg (7,700 lb).

The Cygnus spacecraft consists of two basic components: the Pressurized Cargo Module (PCM) and the Service Module (SM). The PCM is manufactured by Thales Alenia Space in Turin (Italy), the initial PCMs have a volume of 18 m<sup>3</sup>.

The service module is built by Orbital ATK and is based on their GEOStar and LEOStar spacecraft buss as well as components from the development of the Dawn spacecraft. It is currently expected to have a gross mass of 1,800 kg with propulsion provided by thrusters using the hypergolic propellants hydrazine and nitrogen tetroxide and is capable of producing up to 4 kW of electrical power via two gallium arsenide solar arrays. On November 12, 2009, Dutch Space announced it will

provide the solar arrays for the initial Cygnus spacecraft. The fourth and all subsequent Cygnus spacecraft are planned to be of the "enhanced" variant. These will use a stretched PCM which increases the interior volume to 27 m³ and the service module will use Orbital ATK Ultraflex solar arrays which will provide the same amount of power as the previous solar arrays but at a lower mass.

A new upper stage built by Orbital ATK, the Castor 30XL, will be used in conjunction with the enhanced Cygnus; because of the more powerful upper stage and the lighter solar arrays, the payload that Cygnus can deliver to the ISS will be increased by 700 kg.


During nominal CRS missions, Cygnus maneuvers close to the International Space Station, where the Canadarm2 robotic arm grapples the spacecraft and berths it to a Common Berthing Mechanism on the Harmony module in a similar fashion to the Japanese H-II Transfer Vehicle and the other American CRS



vehicle, the SpaceX Dragon. For typical missions, Cygnus is planned to remain berthed for about 30 days. Cygnus does not provide return capability, but can be loaded with obsolete equipment and trash for destructive reentry similar to the Russian Progress vehicles.

A formerly planned variant of Cygnus would have replaced the PCM with the Unpressurized Cargo Module (UCM), based on NASA's ExPRESS Logistics Carrier, and would have been used to transport unpressurized cargo, such as ISS Orbital Replacement Units. Another proposed variant would have replaced the PCM with the Return Cargo Module (RCM), which would have allowed Cygnus to return cargo to Earth.

#### **Review**

The resin parts are solid with crisply molded details and insulating blanket detail molded in place. All parts are still attached to their pour plugs. There is also some flash around the smaller parts, which are identifed by a letter molded into their plugs. Parts are included to build the model with or without the Castor upper stage used to put the spacecraft into orbit. A set of parts represent the folded solar panels if the upper stage is in place.

The instructions consist of front, rear and starboard elevation drawings for both options, supplemented with some text. Each drawing also includes painting and decal location instructions.

The Russians have worked hard on new concepts for armored vehicles since the fall of the USSR in 1991 and one of the concepts they find promising is the heavy infantry combat vehicle - Boyevaya Mashina Pekhoty Tyazheloy or BMPT in Russian. Their first efforts emerged as the Article 199 "Ramka" vehicle, better known by its nickname of "Terminator".



This combined the hull of a T-72/T-90 tank with a turret mounting two 30mm guns, one machine gun, four "Ataka" heavy antitank missiles, and in its first iteration twin "cheek" mounts for 30mm grenade launchers and a crew of five. It ws defined as a tank escort vehicle for use in city fighting or in open combat.

After the failure of the T-95 program, the Russians switched to what was called "T-95 Light" in western circles and what emerged as the Armata heavy combat vehicle family in May 2015.

The family currently is proposed to consist of the T-14 (Article 148) main battle tank, the T-15 (Article 149) BMPT, and the T-16 heavy armored repair and recovery vehicle (BREhM). All share the same basic lower hull platform, engine, armor protection and some of the same self-protection systems such as the "Afghanit" active protection system and a KOEhP electro-optical projection system.

The T-15 has a crew of three but can carry a dismount team of nine men as well with a rear exit ramp. Its "Epokha" turret complex includes a 30mm cannon and coaxial machine gun as well as four "Kornet-D" ATGM missiles.

The Russians have indicated they wish to buy an initial purchase of 2,300 Armata vehicles of all types, but as of this writing have only committed for 100 T-14 tanks in 2018 as money is now tightening.





These vehicles have proven popular with model companies with Meng, Trumpeter and Zvezda all producing the "Terminator" and now Meng, Takom and Panda working on the Armata family to include the T-15 BMPT as well. This is the Panda version of the vehicle and is quite different in the kit's layout from the Takom T-14 kit.

The biggest difference is the tracks - Takom only provides 380 parts for them but then again they did not include the "asphalt" rubber highway pads, which amount to half of the track parts so it is a wash. Each track sprue comes with a jig for assembling the tracks into runs of 12 links each; they are not snap together ones and require cement however.

Assembly begins with the road wheels which have a "keeper" inside so they will rotate as do the idlers; the drivers simply insert into the final drives. Bump stops and mounts are separate parts. The lever action shocks include the levers and attach to the correct road wheel arms. Note that in Step 5 the directions do not indicate the asphalt pads are optional.

Most of the kit's assembly is straightforward with a large number of small details to be added to the upper hull. Rear of the hull is reminiscent of the Merkava with projecting bins on either side of the dismount ramp.

Most of the PE with the kit is useful and sensible but then again there are 34 itty bitty rivet heads which will

be a pain to install. The hatches are moveable but there is no interior other than viewers below them.

Unlike the T-14 the only "reshetka" grill armor panel goes over the dismount ramp at the rear of the hull. Like the hatches, while it may be attached either open or closed there is no interior detail.

The bow armor array is separate and consists of some 18 parts plus the splayed covers over the exhausts on either side of the bow.

The turret comes with all necessary items such as the wind sensor and new style digital enhancing antenna. Each missile launcher pair consists of some 17 parts but are fixed in elevation when mounted. The coaxial gun mount is also fixed in its position. The rest of the turret is covered with sensors and input devices for the various self-protection systems.

One set of markings and one finishing option are provided: Victory Day Parade, 2015, with an overall dark green finish and the "St. George Medal" ribbons and stars on the skirts.

Overall this is a nicely done kit and does match the appearance of the T-15. Keep in mind all of the Armata vehicles shown thus far are only pre-production prototypes and thus each company's effort at producing them is probably no better or worse than another's.


